



## Post War Bungalow Becomes Modern Beauty

It's not often that I get to work with my husband, Alan Endall, on residential projects. He usually only comes out to play on large mixed use urban projects like the Hotel Georgia or The Hudson. So this residential project was like a fresh creative breeze.



Alan took a post war bungalow and designed a thoughtful modernist showcase home without substantially impacting the lot. In fact, only a mere 500 square feet was added, and he actually lowered the profile of the original roof by a foot. The neighbours were relieved to see the plans, the owners simply thrilled.

A year later, and a sophisticated modern home surfaces with roots planted firmly into the heirloom landscape. We designed the interior with materials that supported the owners desire for a seamless indoor/outdoor living environment as well as Alan's conceptual direction.



A 12-foot folding glass NanaWall extends the living room onto concrete outdoor entertainment decks and beautifully landscaped gardens. Natural materials like limestone, glass tile, basalt stone tile floors collectively contributed to give this home an organic quality.
